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Review of PMS QoF in Rotherham

We heard when you heard that NHS Rotherham was hoping to perform a large (300 points) re-organisation of QoF in Rotherham PMS practices. The time scales initially proposed were unworkable and after strong objections from the LMC the PCT have agreed to push back the timetable substantially. It is anticipated that any changes will not now be implemented before April 2011; consultation has also been pushed back by a month allowing as many practices as possible to attend the meetings arranged through the week beginning 22nd Feb.

Despite much talk it is clear that value for money is the prime motivator for the PCT in looking to impose any changes to QoF. The LMC feels that practices are already providing value for money and in particular that QoF is agreed nationally to provide fair recompense for substantial quality improvements.

We have already taken advice from the GPC at a national level. They have told us their position is that PMS practices are entitled to QoF as nationally negotiated; in addition we are in the process of seeking specific legal advice.

Meanwhile practices should do two things: 1) Inspect your recent annual commissioning review reportespecially the value for money comments 2) Review your own PMS contract for any idiosyncrasies that might make general advice inapplicable in your particular case

NHS Appraisal Toolkit

Greg recently circulated details about the down time in this service- it will be offline for the next 2 weeks. The GPC has complained nationally to minsters about this amid some suspicion that this maintenance period is timed to encourage migration to the inferior (many feel) re-validation toolkit. In response the DoH has asked PCTs to be flexible with doctors experiencing difficulties completing appraisal if due to the websites absence.

Have You Claimed?

The PCT are aware of some practices which are not claiming for work done in

regard to a number of enhanced services. The learning disability and ischaemic heart disease primary prevention enhanced services seem to be a particular issue.

Young People Friendly Surgeries

Grants of up to £1500 per practice are available at the PCT to help contractors move towards Young People Friendly status. The required paperwork is extensive but the PCT have promised support in helping complete it.

Fast Response

Last month some concern was raised that the fast response service commissioned from Care UK would not be the equal of the service currently available from CARATS. After talking to the PCT we have been assured that the commissioned service will be reviewed and meanwhile the full range of fast response services will remain unaltered

Controlled Drugs

The PCT are intending to conduct an audit of all aspects of controlled drug prescribing. This will include storage, registers and prescribing.

School Examinations

GMS GPs are not contractually obliged to provide a sick note for pupils who are off sick from school. They are also not obliged to provide sickness certification for students that miss an exam or believe their performance was affected due to illness. The same is likely to apply to other NHS GPs. Unfortunately, many GPs still receive requests for the latter.

The BMA's GPC therefore wrote to the Office of the Qualifications and Examinations Regulator (Ofqual) about this, and their response highlights that medical proof should not be required. Disability Discrimination Act

The GPC have updated their 2003 guidance on the physical adjustments to GP premises required under the Act. The general principle is that a service provider has a duty to take reasonable steps to change the practice or procedure or physical characteristics of a building to make it easier for a disabled person to access the service.
