#### MERRY CHRISTMAS FROM YOUR LMC!!

LMC Meeting 9<sup>th</sup> December 2013

At our last LMC meeting we discussed a range of issues including; DVT pathway, CCG-commissioned primary care, COPD pathway, winter surge plan (including local buddying arrangements), public health performance information (inc. IUCDs) and proposals for a shared care scheme.

#### Alcohol LES

It appears that very few practices are claiming for their alcohol screening. RMBC Public Health are sitting on piles of money trying to give them to practices! This leaves the impression that if the claims are not being made then maybe practices are not doing the work. This could go out to tender if we aren't careful!

#### Ideas for funding

We have been informed there is some money available for non-recurrent funding before the financial year-end. Possible areas suggested by the CCG for funding are for equipment and training. Please contact the CCG if you wish to put forward ideas from your practice.

## Flu vaccinations for staff and GPs.

It has been confirmed at a recent meeting of South Yorkshire LMCs that occupational health don't have facilities to provide this, so staff could be vaccinated at their own practices as temporary residents and costs claimed back from the Area Team.

#### Recommended flu vaccination for children at risk

One of the concerns that practices and LMCs have brought up with the GPC was the contradictory advice given regarding flu vaccine for at-risk children and that practices were recommended to use Fluenz for these patients. The Department Health of (England) has now confirmed that IF a practice gives the intramuscular inactivated flu vaccine to children in the atrisk aroup (not contraindicated) because this was what was available in the practice, this would be acceptable as an alternative to Fluenz.

#### **Data Collection**

There is no uniform data collection form for patients who are vaccinated outside their GP practice and it appears that a variety of methods are being used to notify GP practices of those vaccinated. This has been highlighted to the Area Team the LMC and bv we anticipate that there will be a South Yorkshire wide data collection form for next year.
