Shared care protocols

More patients are being discharged from TRFT on shared care protocols for drugs. e.g. gastroenterology paediatric drugs. However, there is no agreement between RCCG, prescribing advisors or the LMC. Dr Kitlowski, RCCG lead, has asked that any received protocols practices should be sent back to TRFT advising that these have not yet been agreed.

GP Appraisals

Dr Myers will cease to be the lead officer from 31st March 2013. after which local responsibility will be transferred to the Local Area Team in Sheffield, under the direction of the new Responsible Officer. In future, GPs will simply be advised of an appraisal date and expected to attend.

We hope you will join us in thanking Dr Myers for his help and support for GPs during the last ten years.

LMC Elections

Seven GP constituents have been elected as members of the LMC for the new threeyear term commencing 1st April 2013, after which there will be opportunities for cooption.

Please note that all members will be remunerated for their attendance from 1st April. To facilitate this, our statutory/voluntary levies will increase from 36p per patient to 39p per patient, which is in line with neighbouring LMCs and represents an increase of 8%. Prior to this, the LMC levies have remained unchanged for six years.

Enhanced services and practices as providers

From 1st April 2013 the commissioning of LESs by PCTs (as they will demise) will cease and responsibility for local commissioning of services will pass to CCGs (and RMBC for Public Health initiatives). There will be three mechanisms through which CCGs will commission what were formally known as LESs from practices.

1. From GP practices by means of a "standard NHS Contract."

The standard NHS contract will take over from the LESs we are used to as the only means by which your CCG will be able to commission LES-type services directly from your practice, with the practice as sole/preferred provider for your registered list of patients.

2. Any Qualified Provider

This mechanism will mean that your practice will have to compete with other providers. including local hospitals and the private sector, to provide LES-type services for the patients on There list. guarantee that your patients will choose to have the service provided at your practice. therefore guarantee over the volume of service you are able to provide; this will make it difficult to estimate the likely income the service generate for your practice and therefore make any meaningful planning virtually impossible. The service will also be commissioned through the standard NHS contract as detailed above.

3. By means of the NHS tendering /procurement process.

This means practices will have to enter into a competitive bidding process against other potential providers, again including local hospitals and the private sector. This is even

more complex, time-consuming and costly for practices than the standard NHS contract process, and there will be no guarantee that practice bids will be successful.

It is therefore important that all practices understand that, with the probability of the imposed contract changes leading to reductions to practice income from April, it is unlikely that the provision of further enhanced services will be a viable mechanism for bringing in meaningful additional income in future.

Practices need to think about:

- how to respond to the proposed contract changes from April,
- what services you will prioritise providing for your patients,
- how you will go about providing essential services,
- which QOF points you feel are worth chasing,
- how you maintain profitability in the face of falling income and rising expenses, and
- the extent to which you engage in any activities (including CCG and commissioning activity).

The LMC are considering providing a seminar on these issues, including practices as AQPs and would welcome contact from GPs and practices who may be interested.

Calculating Quality Reporting Service (CQRS) Training

Booking for CQRS training (the programme that replaces QMAS) opened on 24th January for GP practices and CCGs. The

first phase of training will begin on 25th February and will be conducted over a three week period. The sessions will be run via Adobe Connect, a web conference application. They will be hosted by a facilitator and users will be able to interact and ask questions. All the material from the training sessions, along with an audio recording, will be made available from 25th February 2013.
