PMS Reviews

At a recent PLT event, the Area Team gave a presentation to Rotherham practices alleging that PMS practices will lose the money released by the reduced QOF points as there was no guidance to put it into baseline. This has caused much disquiet amongst practices.

We have contacted the GPC about this and Richard Vautrey at the GPC noted of the Area Team - "They are wrong in that none of the transferred money will be lost. It will inflate global sum weighted pounds per patient in GMS practices and this will inflate the comparative baseline for PMS practices. However PMS practices will lose money from their "PMS Premium" - the money identified by NHS England that is being paid to PMS practices in excess of GMS practices".

NHS England has in fact identified £325m of "premium" PMS expenditure. This is the amount by which PMS expenditure exceeds the equivalent items of GMS expenditure. The premium will reduce to £235m over 7 vears as GMS correction factor funding is phased out and global sum funding increases. Further information available here:

Catch-up Screening for immunisation

The LMC has mixed feelings about this proposal, as the \pounds 1.50 per patient offer for parts 3 and 4 does not cover postage / admin costs and so any practice signing up for this deal may lose money on it. Therefore practices need to consider carefully the financial impact.

Public Health Contracts

LMC The have been informed that the standard public health contract from the Department of Health will be used for public health contracts. One of the key points of difference was the level of public liability (£10m) and employers' liability (£5m) per practice for all public health contracts. Practices should take note that they can meet these insurance requirements. contained within the 80 page+ documentation.
